## **Sands China Executives Win China's First Hotelier Awards** *Two trophies contribute to a fantastic year for the integrated resort*

In its inaugural year, The Hotelier Awards received close to 300 applications from more than 100 hotel properties within 44 different brands throughout mainland China, Macao and Hong Kong. The winners of each category were decided by a panel of independent experts through a two-round process and were based on a combination of facts presented in their application, personal interviews and testimonials.
