(Macao, June 16, 2014) – In support of the annual Macao Energy Conservation Week organized by the Office for the Development of the Energy Sector (GDSE), Sands China's properties including Sands[®] Macao, The Venetian[®] Macao, The Plaza[™] Macao and Sands[®] Cotai Central turned off their non-essential exterior lighting for one hour Monday night from 8:30-9:30 p.m., helping raise the awareness of the importance of energy conservation in Macao. In addition, Sands China has extended its support to Macao Energy Conservation Week this year by sponsoring the venues for the campaign's kick off ceremony, as well as the award ceremony and exhibition of the Dress Casual Summer fashion design competition.

"Sands China has a long-standing strategy of implementing environmentally sustainable initiatives at all its properties," said Gunther Hatt, Executive Vice President of Operations for Sands China Ltd. "With our corporate Sands ECO360° programme in place, we're constantly looking for new ways and improving existing measures aimed at reducing wastage of water, electricity and food, and increasing recycling. We've also initiated Earth Hour, Every Month in 2013, which has encouraged other hotels from Macao and other countries to join in the challenge as well. We are very happy to take part in Macau Energy Conservation Week again and also be able to offer more support to this very meaningful campaign."

This year, Sands China decided to take its support to the Macao government's energysaving campaign to a new level by providing the venues for three of its events. The Macao Energy Conservation Week 2014 Kick Off Ceremony was held June 15 at the Cotai Arena; the award ceremony of the Dress Casual Summer fashion design competition and a fashion show will be held June 17 at St. Mark's Square at Shoppes at Venetian; and the exhibition showcasing the winning designs will take place at Shoppes at Cotai Central between June 20 and July 3.

As part of Macau Energy Saving Week 2014, the company will also be participating in the Smart Casual Summer activity that will extend until the end of August, by encouraging non-operations team members to work in smart casual attire, thus allowing the air conditioners to be set to no lower than 25 degree Celsius. Other measures targeted at encouraging more

Sands China team members to consume less energy include placing promotional materials in the staff areas of all properties.

Various energy-saving measures in place under the Sands ECO360° green initiative help Sands China properties aim for higher standards of sustainability. In the area of electricity conservation, the installation of energy saving LED lights has saved a total of 17.5 million kWh of electricity in 2013 – enough to power more than 46,000 households every month. These and other eco-minded measures have garnered recognition for several of Sands China properties. In April, The Venetian[®] Macao became the first entity in Macao and one of the first two integrated resorts in Asia to receive the prominent ISO 20121 Event Sustainability Management System certification, a strong testament to the success of the company's ongoing sustainability efforts. Sands China Ltd. was also recently announced winner of the IMEX GMIC Green Supplier Award at the IMEX Gala Dinner in Frankfurt, Germany in May, as well as the China Green Enterprise Award 2014 for the category of Outstanding Sustainable Development Enterprise. In addition, Conrad Macao, Cotai Central; Sheraton Macao Hotel, Cotai Central; and Holiday Inn Macao Cotail Central have just each received a Macau Green Hotel Gold Award from the Macao SAR Government.
